COMMON PBIS MYTHS

The positive in PBIS means we give out rewards.

Truth: The positive refers to a change of focus from reactive, constantly pointing out what students did wrong (negatives) to proactive, teaching and recognizing what students are doing right (positives).

We will no longer punish children for inappropriate behavior.

Truth: PBIS does not ignore problem behavior. It views appropriate consequences as those that are effective in changing the student's problem behavior. Schools plan for problem behavior by matching the level of consequences to the severity of the problem behaviors & maintaining consistency across the school.
