



Earned Credits

- Required courses and electives

Verified credits

- pass the class and pass the SOL

Industry Credential

pass an exam that earns you a career/technical credential

How Do I Become a Junior or Sophomore?

- Students earn a credit for each class in which a "D" or higher is earned.
- A specified number of credits earned each school year is required to advance to the next grade level.
- Please see page 5 in the 2022-2023 Program of Studies.
- Earning an "F" in a required course = must retake class, earn a
 "D" or higher to graduate.

Promotion

Students working toward a Standard or Advanced Studies Diploma will be promoted based on credits earned:

Grade Level	Credits Required	Credit Information
Tenth Grade (Sophomore)	5	Of the five credits, three must be credits required for graduation, one of which is English.
Eleventh Grade (Junior)	11	Of the eleven credits, seven must be credits required for graduation, four of which must be English, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
Twelfth Grade (Senior)	17	Of the seventeen credits, four credits must be earned in English, Math, Science, and Social Studies; sufficient credits (and verified credits) must be planned to ensure graduation in May.

How Are My Final Year Grades Determined?

$$(S1 + S2)/2 = Y1$$

- Your final grade for the year is determined by adding your 1st semester grade (S1) and your 2nd semester grade (S2), then dividing by 2
- Reflect on 1st semester:
 - What are your S1 grades for each of your classes?
 - Do you need to spend more time working on your assignments and studying?
 - Do you need to attend after school tutoring?
 - Do you need to meet with any of your teachers and discuss a plan to help you be successful in their class?

What Does GPA Mean?

- GPA = Grade Point Average
- Each letter grade is worth points.
- GPA is calculated by adding up the point value for all final grades and then dividing by the total number of courses taken.






