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## School Profile 2022/2023

### COVID-19 UPDATE

**Spring 2020** - Winchester Public Schools closed on March 13, 2020 at the end of the 3rd quarter due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Beginning April 15, 2020, teachers began teaching new content for 4th quarter through asynchronous, virtual learning opportunities. Students were given a Pass/Fail (P/F) grade for Quarter 4 and were awarded a letter grade for the Semester based on the quality and quantity of work completed, as determined by the individual teacher.

**2020 - 2021** - Students had a choice between 100% distance learning and a hybrid model where students attended school in person two days a week and participated in a combination of synchronous and asynchronous learning the other three days. Students who chose 100% distance learning did not have access to many of our Career/Technical Education (CTE) courses. We saw an increase in students utilizing our online learning programs, Edgenuity and Virtual Virginia.

**Fall 2021** - All students are in person, 5-days a week on a modified block schedule with A & B days; classes are year-long.

### CURRICULUM AND PROGRAMS

- The curriculum at John Handley High School is designed to provide students with a comprehensive offering of academic and CTE courses. The strong instructional program is complemented by a wide range of athletic and co-curricular activities.
- John Handley HS operates on a modified block schedule with A & B days, making classes year-long. Prior to 2021-2022, the HS operated on a 4x4 block schedule.

- Emil & Grace Shihadeh Innovation Center - new for the 2021-2022 school year, students elect to take a CTE course and one core class at our Innovation Center campus; students are provided a learning environment where they have both voice and choice; are guided by teacher mentors in navigating and managing their time; there are no bells and students are taught how to negotiate time between the core class and the career and technical education class.
- **Advanced Placement (AP)** - College-level courses
  - English - Language and Composition, Literature and Composition
  - Social Science - World History, US History, US Government and Politics
  - Math - Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics
  - Science - Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1: Algebra-based, Environmental Science
  - Foreign Language - German Language and Culture; French Language and Culture; Spanish Language and Culture, Latin
  - Fine Art - Studio Art
- **Dual Enrollment (DE)** - John Handley HS offers many dual enrollment courses through Lord Fairfax Community College in the core academic and CTE areas. All sections of the courses below are taught at the college level and students may opt-in to receive college credit at their own expense..
  - English - AP English Language, AP English Literature
  - Social Science - AP World History, AP US History, AP US Government
  - Math - Calculus, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Statistics
  - Science - AP Biology, Anatomy & Physiology, AP Physics 1: Algebra-based
  - CTE - Adv. CIS, Medical Systems Administration, Medical Lab Tech I/II; Cybersecurity Systems Tech. I/II
- **Virtual Virginia** - Students may select from a variety of course options and earn high school credit through a co-synchronous e-learning model, including AP classes.

- Added Weight for AP/DE classes: An additional .5 weight is added in for AP/DE courses and .5 for taking the AP exams which is then averaged into the overall GPA.
