The [Virginia EL Supervisors' Association](#) is proud to be able to offer [scholarships to English Learners](#) who are planning to continue their studies at a college, university, community college, or work-force training programs.

We encourage English learner (EL) teachers (AKA: ESOL teachers) and school counselors to assist eligible students in gathering the required documents so that all applications will be complete at the time of mailing. Incomplete application packets will not be considered. You may duplicate the application as necessary. The deadline for all applications is **April 26, 2024 by 5:00pm EST.**

The following criteria will be used for scholarship consideration:

- Enrolled in an ESL program for at least one year in grades 6-12 in a Virginia public school
- Enrolled in 12th grade at the time of application

- Financial need
- The strength of the student produced essay

Please note the importance of a local contact person taking the time to assist the student in completing ALL sections of the application. Due to the large number of applicants each year, the committee will not be able to personally follow-up on sections of the application that are missing.

James Stutzman Sr. Scholarship -fee waiver code, GO2SU

Eligibility Requirements:

- The scholarship applicant must intend to major in business at Shenandoah University.
- The scholarship applicant must be a graduate of a local high school, including, but not limited to Clarke County HS, James Wood HS, John Handley HS, Millbrook HS or Sherando HS.
- The scholarship applicant must have achieved a high school grade point average of 2.0 or higher
- The scholarship applicant must demonstrate financial need. Completion of the FAFSA is required to demonstrate financial need
- Applications must be received by April 12, 2024

James R. Wilkins Scholarship -fee waiver code, GO2SU

Eligibility Requirements:

- The applicant must intend to enroll as an undergraduate student at Shenandoah University
- The applicant must be graduating from a local high school, including, but not limited to Clarke County High School, James Wood High School, John Handley High School, Millbrook High School or Sherando High school.
- The applicant must be in the top 10 percent of their class based on their high school grade point average.
- Applications must be received by April 12, 2024

Claude Moore Scholar Scholarship 2024

Eligibility:

- **Must be a Virginia Resident**
- **Must have been enrolled in a Claude Moore Scholar program or class**
- **Graduating senior in high school**
- **Attending an advanced certificate program, community college, or higher education program.**
- **Meet the Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements of the institution**
- **Must be continuing their career pursuit in health care.**

Description:

Scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors who have taken health sciences classes provided with funds from the Claude Moore Charitable Trust. Students must be enrolled in a course or academic program that furthers their career in health care. Scholarship funds will assist with tuition, fees, books and other related expenses.

Essay

A 400-word essay that answers: How has being a part of the CM Scholars program helped you in your career path? Consider including: What motivates you to pursue a higher education; The major forces or obstacles in your life that led to this path of study; What you plan to do after school and how this may benefit humankind.

High School Transcript

Letter of Acceptance

Letter of acceptance from a 2- or 4-year accredited college in the United States, or documentation of current enrollment (e.g., registration confirmation) in college. If you are a high school senior and have not yet received a letter of acceptance, one must be provided upon receipt of the scholarship. If you are a high school senior and have not yet received a letter of acceptance, please include a page that indicates that you are still waiting for a letter.

Claude Moore Teacher Verification

This must be completed by your health science teacher or CTE administrator.

Scholarships Offered by D.C. Chapter of the National Naval Officers Association

For the past 36 years the Washington D.C. Chapter of the National Naval Officers Association (DCNNOA) has provided scholarship opportunities to graduating minority seniors from the DC metropolitan area (Maryland, Washington, DC and Northern VA). We are a non-profit 501(C3) organization.

Each year DCNNOA awards over 30 scholarships starting at \$1,000.00 to minority youth from the Washington, DC Metropolitan area based on academic achievement, positive community involvement, commitment, and financial need. Scholarship recipients select their major and attend the college or university of their choice without any obligation to join or affiliate with the military. An applicant needs to submit only one application package and he or she will be considered for any of our scholarships for which they meet the requirements.

As a measure to accommodate continued challenging times, “unofficial” transcripts are acceptable. Applications should be completed to the student’s best ability and certified by a school counselor or staff for accuracy of grades and extracurricular activities. Students must submit a COMPLETE application package that is verified by his or her school by May 24, 2024 in order to be considered for a scholarship. Further instructions and requirements for completing our 2023 application are also posted on our website.

NOTE: Students selected to receive a DCNNOA scholarship will be notified directly via telephone call. Please ensure an active telephone number is listed on the application form.
