Pros and Cons of Community College First

Pros

- Starting in a smaller setting can make a big difference.
- Lowers cost
- Increased flexibility (i.e. more night classes) and smaller class sizes
- Work opportunities with a 2 year associate's degree
- Chance to improve your grades
- No SAT/ACT required

Cons

- Limited curriculum (there may be more general education course offerings you're interested in at a 4 year university)
- You might have to retake some classes **or** test out of them (if going out of state)
- Clubs, extracurricular activities, and forming bonds with your cohort might not happen as easily.

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G3 Program through Laurel Ridge

Who is eligible for the G3 Program?

Any Virginia resident who:

- Qualifies for in-state tuition
- Has a total household income of less than or equal to 400% of the Federal Poverty Level (roughly an income of \$100,000 for a family of four)
- Is enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours in a Virginia community college
- Is enrolled in a designated G3 program
- Has applied for federal and/or state financial aid programs.

What are the designated programs?

- Healthcare
- Information Technology
- Manufacturing and Skilled Trades
- Early Childhood Education
- Public Safety

How does tuition assistance work?

G3 Program funds make up the difference between what federal or state financial aid pays for and the cost of tuition, fees, and books for the program.

What do 4 year colleges look for?

- GRADES!! (mainly in core classes)
 - Strength of curriculum (look at all courses offered at JHHS)
 - SAT or ACT scores (many schools are still test optional)
 - Essay or Writing Sample
 - Extracurricular involvement
 - School & Community
 - Consistency & Commitment vs. Numbers
 - Student Demonstrated Interest

The Tests: SAT and ACT

Test Scores:

- Sent directly from the testing agency to college – you must request it.
 - SAT/ACT gives you four free score reports
(can request up to 7 days after test)
USE THESE FREE REPORTS
 - Schools Superscore (mix and match highest score)
 - Subject test were discontinued by College Board in Jan. 2021
- Remember good test taking habits: full night of sleep, breakfast, etc.

Applying to College

- **Types of Deadlines**

- Early Action – Non binding (Taking action)
- Early Decision – Binding (Making a decision)
- Regular Decision
 - (usually notified Early April) **Respond by May 1**
- Rolling Admission

- **DEADLINES, DEADLINES, DEADLINES**

- Early Action/Early Decision deadlines: Are typically October and November
- Regular Decision: December/January

 - Leadership

 - Essay – If it is optional, DO IT! Customize essay to each school, some allow video essays
 - Short Answer Questions

Other Items Needed

- **Recommendations** Counselor/Teacher/Coach/Club Advisor –
 - Ask and allow 3 weeks
 - Give a brief resume of involvement and accomplishments
 - Provide a stamped /addressed envelope
 - Emailed recommendation→ make sure you tell the teacher
- **High School Transcript**
 - Students now request their transcript electronically through **Parchment**
*It is FREE
 - Allow 2 work weeks before deadline

Request a Transcript

- PARCHMENT
 - Parchment is used for ALL transcript requests, including the Common App, as well as, sending transcripts to individual schools.
 - Laurel Ridge CC (Transcript Request) - should be done AFTER you've committed to a college and your Spring grades are final.
 - For final transcript requests select "Hold for final grades" on Parchment

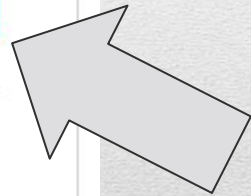

 - Merit based scholarships require that your application be turned in around the November/December time frame (varies depending on the school).
 - require FAFSA to be considered for institutional aid

 - For Freshman, it typically is put onto your award letter and then you may have to follow up with additional paperwork with the financial aid office.
