This year's Pamplin Leadership Award (PLA) season is now open! The PLA was established by Robert B. Pamplin, Sr. (VT Class of 1933) and Robert B. Pamplin, Jr. to acknowledge students who demonstrate superior intellectual promise, academic performance, dedication to their communities, interest and success in physical fitness and health, and unimpeachable integrity.

The PLA is a one-year, merit-based \$5,000 Virginia Tech scholarship presented to up to forty qualified students from Virginia's public high schools. Students must have a 3.8 or better GPA.

The application is online through the link above, which is only available to students once they submit their undergraduate admissions application. Students will follow these instructions to access the PLA application:

- Students who have completed a VT undergraduate application will receive instructions to create a Guest Account 1-3 days after submitting the application.
- The login credentials used to create a Guest Account also allow a student access to Scholarship Central.
- Once the general scholarship application is complete, a student may apply for the PLA (https://vt.academicworks.com/opportunities/53039)

<u>Do not mail paper applications or supplemental materials! They will not be considered.</u> Your high school's nominee must complete the following in the PLA application:

- Essay: In an essay of 500 words or fewer, discuss your understanding of effective leadership. [1] What are some qualities of effective leadership? [2] How do you measure effective leadership? [3] Describe the qualities of one effective leader you know, including evidence of how they exemplify these qualities. [4] Where, when, and how have you applied these qualities in your own leadership roles to date? [5] How, specifically, do you intend to continue your development as a leader at Virginia Tech?
- Name and email address of a high school official (usually the student's counselor) who will verify that the applicant is the high school's nominee. The official will then receive electronic notification with instructions to validate the student.

Community Foundation 2025 Scholarship program

The Community Foundation for a greater Richmond is pleased to announce the 2025 scholarship program for students living in the Richmond region and across Virginia. Each of our 70 scholarships were established by a generous individual, family, or organization with a desire to assist high school students, recent high school graduates, and adult learners continue their education. Last year, the Foundation

awarded more than \$520,000 in scholarships to students pursuing higher education degrees.

Eligibility criteria, unique to each scholarship, and application information can be accessed on the Foundation's <u>website</u>. All applications and supporting materials must be submitted through our online system by March 6, 2025, by 5:00 pm. Please encourage students to request transcripts and letter(s) of recommendation well in advance of the deadline as we will not be able to offer deadline extensions.

- Transcripts do not need to be official, but MUST include grades from the 2024 fall semester.
- Letters of recommendation are uploaded by the recommender through the online system. The recommender will receive an email that contains a link to the online system to upload their letter.

Please note that in addition to scholarship funds for four-year colleges/universities, a scholarship offering for students planning to attend trade, vocational, or technical schools is available. <u>Last year, there were no applicants for this program from within Virginia so these students are strongly encouraged to apply.</u> Applicants should select "Vocational Application" at the link provided above.

Application Instructions

Download and complete the application from the link provided above.

Students should assemble their application into a single PDF file ensuring that all attachments are included. The pdf document should be no larger than 25 MB. Please see additional instructions at the Virginia JCI Senate website.

Applications must be postmarked no later than January 17, 2025. The completed application in PDF format should be emailed virginiajcisenatescholarship@gmail.com by midnight January 17, 2025.

Two scholarships for college/university and one vocational scholarship will be awarded by the Virginia JCI Senate. Winners are eligible to compete for additional scholarships from the US JCI Senate and will be notified with instructions for forwarding the

completed hard copy application with original signature to Cindy Kinney, Virginia JCI Senate Scholarship chair.
